



南加州華人牙醫師學會會章

一、名稱:

中文:南加州華人牙醫師學會

英文:Chinese American Dental Society of Southern California (簡稱 CADSSC)

二、本會為一非營利之社團法人,其宗旨為:

- 1. 促進華人牙醫師間之聯繫與切磋、學術交流及經驗分享,定期舉辦學術及專業再教育活動,提升會員之專業知識。
- 2. 廣集各牙醫之專才以謀取牙醫界之福利。
- 3. 促進華人牙醫界之學術地位及與其他社團之關係、交流與聯繫。
- **4.** 聯絡會員感情,互助合作,砥礪學行,增進文化及社區服務,以共謀會員、病人、及社區之福利。

三、會員資格:

凡居住在南加州之華裔牙醫師或華裔牙科學生並贊同本會會章者,均得為本會會員:

- 1. 一般會員:凡華人或華裔具加州牙醫師執照者,得以繳交年費成為該年度一般會員。
- 2. 學生會員:凡華人或華裔就讀於各大牙醫學院,或加州居民已申報考加州牙醫師執照者,得以繳納學生年度會費,成為該年度學生會員。學生會員不具提名、投票及表決之權。
- 3. 榮譽會員:經理事會提名,審定通過,為期二年。榮譽會員亦不具提名、投票及表決之權。
- 4. 永久會員:凡具一般會員資格並一次繳齊永久會費(6年之年費)者,為永久會員。

四、會員權利與義務:

會員有參加本會活動,享受本會一切福利及服務之權利,有出席大會,行使選舉及被選舉之權利。會員並有按期繳納會費及營助會務之義務。

五、組織:

- 本會以理事會為最高權力及決策機構,其設有會長、副會長、秘書長、財務長、 總務長、三位顧問、及另十位理事共十八位理事會成員。理事會並設有提名委員會 以協助提名各項選舉。
- 2. 理事改選由提名委員會決定名額(每年約改選 1/3)及提名,會員亦可加提一名 (write in candidate),由全體會員經通訊投票產生任期為三年,連選得連任。

- **4.** 副會長由提名委員會從理事會成員中提名一至二位人選,由理事會票選而生, 任期一年,並於第二年接任會長之職。
- 5. 秘書長、財務長、總務長由會長從理事會成員中任命並經理事會同意而生,隨會長任期為一年,連撰得連任。
- 6. 提名委員會乃是由會長以及三位顧問所組成。
- 7. 會長並可依實際需要,設立特別小組或委員會,由會長就理事或會員中提名並經 理事會同意,任期視需要而定。

六、職權:

- 1. 大會職權:大會得以通訊方式,或由**2/3**以上之永久會員及當年繳費會員以集會方式,通過修改或增訂會章。
- 2. 理事會職權:協助會長等推動會務;決定本會一切重大事項;監督本會一切財務及 行政;選舉及罷免會長、副會長及提名委員會成員。
- 3. 會長職權:召開理事會、工作會議,對外代表本會,對內執行會務,向大會及 理事會負責。
- 4. 副會長職權:協助會長處理會務,會長缺席時得代行其職權。
- 5. 秘書長、財務長、總務長等則各司其職,協助會長推動會務,向會長及理事會負責。

七、選舉:

- 1. 大會選舉及各項決議事項,均以會員投票總數之簡單多數為通過。
- 2. 理事會選舉及各項決議事項,除會章另有規定外,任何提案須由理事會半數以上 理事出席,出席理事過半數贊成才得以通過。





Dentist's Role in Cleft Lip and Palate Treatment Team and the Use of PNAM Appliance in Cleft Lip and Palate Treatment

Introduction

The prevalence of cleft lip and palate (CLP) is as high as in one of every 700 to 1000 newborns in the United States (1,2). The cause of CLP can be multifactorial such as genetics, drugs, vitamin deficiency or excess, cigarette smoking, environmental factors or unknown factors. In a lot of different cultures there are jinx and mystery of cause of CLP. For example, in Chinese culture some believe doing construction while mother is pregnant or in Mexican culture some believe use scissors while pregnant could be the cause of CLP. No matter what is the cause of CLP,

once the infant was born with CLP there are multiple health issues need to be solved. This long treatment journey could be very difficult for patient, parents and health professionals.

In the united states once the infant was born with CLP, the patient will be referred to a special care team (craniofacial team) which consist with pediatrician, plastic surgeon, feeding consultant, speech pathologist, ENT, pediatric dentist, orthodontist, oral surgeon, social worker, prosthodontist etc. Dentists play an important role in the treatments such as presurgical soft/hard tissue molding, regular dental check up due to high caries

risk, orthodontic treatment, orthognathic surgery, implant, restoration and speech prosthesis.

Presurgical orthopedic soft/ hard tissue molding

Presurgical orthopedic or soft/hard tissue molding of the CLP has become the treatment of choice in many craniofacial teams. This treatment modality is used to reduce the soft tissue cleft and facilitate lip repair. It precludes the need for lip adhesion with the attendant operative risks, expense and potential tissue damage.

Presurgical orthopedics for the treatment of CLP has been in use since the early 1500's when Franco described the use of an extraoral head cap prior to surgical intervention. In the late 1700's numerous researchers and surgeons began to experiment with bandages over the prolabium to stimulate muscle retraction with force, compressing the premaxillary region. In 1844 Hullihen used adhesive straps to prepare and close alveolar clefts prior to surgery (7). In early 1950 Mc Neil developed an oral prosthesis, similar to an obturator, to approximate the cleft alveolar segments. He modified his appliance such that he was able to reduce the cleft by redirecting the direction of facial growth (8). Many orthopedic presurgical techniques have evolved (7,8). Huebener and Liu (3) classified the appliances as intraoral, extraoral, surgical, postsurgical, active or passive.

In the early 1980's Latham developed the pinned retained orthopedic appliance to exert a foreword force on the posterior segment of the unilateral cleft maxilla. For the bilateral clefts he designed a similar appliance to control the posterior width of the maxilla, while retracting the premaxilla with a light constant force with the aid of a staple and power chain. (9) The advantage is fast and not taking too much of dentist time. However, the disadvantages including multiple general anesthesia for patient (impression, delivery, remove), collapse of dental arch, possible dislodge of pins, pain, infection of surgical sites and damage of dental follicles.

Thirty years ago, Grayson and Cutting

introduced the presurgical nasal alveolar molding (PNAM) appliance. This allows the surgeon to repair the lip, nose and gingiva with one surgical procedure. This appliance not only molds the affected intraoral and extraoral structures, but it also provides nasal support to mold the collapsed nostrils. It improves the position and symmetry of the nasal deformities. (Figure 1,2) Intraoral results have shown significant reduction on the size of the cleft. Presurgical nasal alveolar molding (PNAM) as it is known today was developed as an improvement on the Latham appliance (7,10). Grayson's appliance works by taking advantage of the plasticity and lack of elasticity of the neonatal cartilage during the first couple months after birth (7,11,12).

Objectives of Presurgical Nasal Alveolar Molding (PNAM) Appliance

The objectives of PNAM therapy in the unilateral and bilateral cleft patient is to: 1) approximate and align the alveolar segments, 2) correct the alar base and cartilage of the affected nostril 3) reposition the philtrum, nasal septum and columella along the midsagittal plane and 4) lessen closure tension after lip repair (7,8,11,13). 5) it improves feeding and swallowing and breathing thru the elevation of the collapsed nostril.

Modified PNAM appliance and update clinical protocol

In Grayson's clinical protocol, the impression for NAM appliance should be taken within 1st or 2nd week of birth. In the Loma Linda University's new updated protocol, the impression in fact is taken in 5 to 6 weeks old infant. The reason of late starting is to reduce the need of taking impression in OR under General Anesthesia. Also during the 5th and 6 th weeks the infant has developed the neck supporting muscle and airway protect reflux, so the patient can lift the head up if the airway is blocked patient will have the ability to lift up the head to protect the airway. The PNAM impression of maxilla needs to be handling with cautions. If the impression is taken

in the clinical environment, suction with small tip and 100% oxygen and oxygen mask should be ready. The impression material should have enough tensile strength to prevent the incidence of impression material breakage or swallowing by the infant. When taking impression, the infant will be held upside-down to prevent the impression material from falling into the airway. A constant neck support should be used during impression. Carefully observe the patient's skin color and activity level to make sure patient is not in hypoxia status. Once the impression is taken the stone cast should be poured soon. The alveolar wax up to connect the alveolar segments and also block the undercut of the stone cast.

The base of molding appliance is made out of acrylic resin and is polished and fitted for insertion. Two stabilize buttons added on the base of appliance with a wire core which allow the direction of stabilize buttons to be adjusted. Also the different direction of stabilize button helps the rubber band to increase tension in desired direction to help soft tissue growth. The soft tissue growth is a critical factor affect future surgical result and need to soft tissue flaps.

Nasal stent(s) consists of a .025 mm stainless steel wire with a helix coil attached to the labial flange of the molding plate (using a retention loop and hard acrylic). The extra oral extension of the wire ends with an acrylic bulb made out of a hard acrylic core which is lined with soft acrylic.(15) It extends into the affected nasal dome and alar cartilages. (Figure 4) The nasal stents provide support and mold the affected nostrils into a more symmetrical shape. The nasal stent is designed to apply selective pressure and gradually stretch or pull the affected tissues of the nose.

Extra oral tape and rubber bands should be used to increase the retention of appliance. The taping should choose minimum scaring, good retention, water proof and with flexibility. Tegaderm, duoderm, wound closure strip and micro-pore (3M) paper tapes are all good choices of tape. The success of the molding appliance is improved by taping together the lip segments across the cleft. The tape produces a controlled movement of the alveolar segments, improves the deviated columella and moves the affected nostril and tip of nose into an upright position.

Parents are instructed to remove the appliance daily in order to clean the infant's mouth and food debris and/or secretions on the appliance. The taping should not be change too often because the remove of taping could damage the surface of skin and causing minor trauma. The PNAM appliance is continuously adjusted by selectively grinding the area into which the alveolar bone segments are supposed to move to. These gradual changes result in a more symmetrical maxillary arch (6,7,11,12,14). So clinician should observe the movement very carefully and make the best estimation and guide the alveolar segment to move to the best position. Unilateral CLP usually will take up to 3 month of PNAM treatment, but bilateral CLP will take long time up to 5-6 months. The use of the PNAM appliance assists the practitioner in meeting the goal of presurgical orthopedics which is to normalize anatomy by reducing the uncontrollable forces that frequently cause collapse of the maxillary arch.

A number of studies have shown that externally PNAM increases columellar width, decreases columellar deviation, and increases height of the affected nostril, resulting in a more symmetrical nostril. The same studies demonstrated that internally a reduced alveolar cleft with aligned and approximate alveolar segments was achieved. (3,7,10,11,13) (Fig 5,6)

The Advantages and Disadvantages of **PNAM** appliance

There are a number of advantages associated with use of the PNAM appliance. One is that use of the PNAM appliance achieves an increased symmetry of both the soft and hard tissue. This in turn decreases the extent of primary lip and nasal surgery, which minimizes the extent of scar tissue formation. The molding appliance also serves as an obturator, facilitating the creation of negative pressure during the swallowing process. This increases the amount of formula ingested and shortens the feeding time resulting in less of an energy expenditure on the infant's part. Not

only can the infant be better fed, but the tongue can also be trained to occupy a better position during the swallowing phase and resting position. The three cases of using PNAM appliance to treat unilateral (Figure 4-16) and bilateral (Figure 17-24) CLP patients can show the advantages clearly.

The major disadvantage of the PNAM is that it is a labor-intensive procedure. It requires a significant parental commitment; because without their help the pediatric dentist's continuous adjustments can not be productive. In addition, minor trauma to the soft tissue can occur, due to the continuous use of tape to reposition the affected segments of the lip (11). However the advantages far outweigh the disadvantages.

Conclusion

Dentists play an important role in treating CLP patient. With proper dental treatment CLP patient can have a much better final outcome. Excellent results have been achieved using PNAM appliance by increase both the hard tissue and soft tissue symmetry, which decreases the extent of surgery required for repairing the lip and palate. With the proper and multi disciplinary approach of dental treatment, CLP patients will have better esthetics and functional results, which will lead to a better quality of life.




Figure 3: PNAM appliance with nasal stent which included a base plate (clear), 2 stabilized button and one nasal stent and the soft reline material (pink)






Figure 13: Case 1, 3 years follow up, (front view and close up)






Figure 14: Case 1 four years follow up (front view and close up)

管道的開路先鋒: 手動路徑搜索銼

摘要

搜尋阻塞或已經鈣化的管道熬心費力又費時;偶爾也會有吃上閉門羹不得其門而 入的窘境。所有的管道蒐尋文獻將手動路徑搜索銼和鎳鈦旋轉路徑搜索銼及滑行路徑 混為一談,本文獻回顧避談鎳鈦旋轉路徑搜索銼而專注於多樣化手動路徑搜索銼的探 討,包含種類、特性、優缺點等,提供給讀者參考。


理想的管道清創擴大與修形是根管治療成功的一大關鍵,但技術上往往是個難題,主要的原因是管道空間的不規則性,非圓形的橫切面,多方向面的彎曲,管道分叉,扁鰭形空隙管道,及鈣化性變形(calcific metamorphosis)……等等¹。管道及管道入口的搜尋是清創擴大的入門,不得其門而入也是牙醫師們偶爾會遇到的技術上的難題²,要蒐尋進入管道並保持暢通到根尖孔端也不容易³。要順利地探勘阻塞或鈣化的管道可以從「困難到不可能」⁴,夠直白的講法,但管道不可能進入並不表示要植牙,窮則思變,萬事總有變通的辦法來解決,根管治療也不例外。

如果我們只專注於嶄新的技術或設備, 可能容易忽略或放棄舊有的設施。例如,鎳 鈦旋轉根管銼剛剛問世的幾年之間,沒有人 意識到需要先以手動根管銼預備來舖設滑行 路徑 (initial manual glide path) 及精緻再造 的滑行路徑(reproducible glide path),而把 旋轉根管銼直接用來滑行到根尖狹窄區。幾 十年之後,牙醫師們才體會出鎳鈦旋轉根管 銼的尖端沒有切削功能及銼體太柔韌,用它 直接來探勘管道很容易造成折斷 5 或其他醫源 性的失誤。West 在 2006 年對「滑行路徑」 (glide path) 的定義為:由冠端管道的開口 至根尖端的一個平滑通道⁶,在 West 的 2011 年文章也再度的強調,除非滑行路徑已經存 在或已經預備好了,直接使用鎳鈦旋轉根 管銼或順逆重複運轉式根管銼是很危險的, 最終的結果是根管銼斷裂或管道被阻塞 7,8。 2001年, Bergmans 倡議如果沒有以手動路徑 搜索銼做好預備的滑行路徑,旋轉根管銼是 不許可進入管道的 9,10。目前,每一家鎳鈦旋 轉根管銼的廠商都有生產自己的「鎳鈦旋轉 路徑搜索銼」(rotary NiTi pathfinder)。

經過周詳的診斷,確定一顆牙齒必須要 做根管治療, 髓腔打開以後的第一個步驟是 去除髓腔內的鈣化結石或修復性牙本質,探 勘所有管道的存在。以小號K型根管銼(例 如 8 或 10 號) 探勘 (negotiate 或 explore) 每一個管道由根管開口到根尖狹窄區或根尖 孔是否有通暢?如果已經有,表示滑行路徑 (glide path) 已經自然存在;如果沒有,則 要做管道的探索(canal exploration 或 negotiation),稱之管道探勘(canal scouting)。 在年齡不大的成人牙齒或未經過慢性蛀牙摧 殘或多次填補過的牙齒,其管道從根管入口 (canal orifice) 到根尖孔可能已經自然暢通, 屬於比較簡易的管道清創牙齒。然而,一些 經過多重填補過的牙齒, 因為受到自然防衛 機轉 (nature defense mechanism) 的保護而 閉門塞戶,髓腔結石或修復性牙本質無處不 在,使管道的探索不容易,如果又加上管道 多面向的彎曲,必須花費很多時間在探勘管 道上。絕大部分的齒內鈣化是從髓腔以及頸 部管道三分之一鈣化起, 而不是從根尖孔鈣 化起,如圖1。管道的探勘過程如有失誤, 容易造成管壁穿孔(perforation)、管道偏離 (transportation)、窗台(ledge)的形成、 或管道阻塞等醫源性失誤,而導致清創不完 全並且會減少治療以後的成功率1,或因為窗 台的產生而有必要做根尖手術來解決問題 11。 要做根尖段三分之一管道的探勘之前,得先 把頸部及中段部分的管道以冠降法(crown down preparation) 或稱冠端預擴大(coronal pre-flaring),也可以手動平衡力法(balance force method) 擴大 12 為之。如此,可以讓 沖洗液如四醋酸醛乙烯二胺螯合劑 (EDTA) 或NaOCI浸潤管道,讓手動路徑搜索銼在管 道裡容易而且安全地進出。實驗顯示冠端的 預先擴大可以減少根管銼的折斷率 13。"scouter file" 這個名詞第一次被引用的是 Ruddle 在 他 2001 年的文章,以後被沿用至今14,它可 以探索管道的通暢性及彎曲走向。Scout的 英文定義: exploration of the root canal to obtain information on anatomy, geometry and clinical reality。「手動路徑搜索銼」可以稱之 為 Scouter file。要有別於鎳鈦旋轉路徑搜索 銼(rotary NiTi pathfinder),作者認為以「手 動路徑搜索銼」(hand pathfinder 或 manual pathfinder) 來命名也許比較恰當。

鎳鈦旋轉根管銼問世至今已經有三十個年頭,使用之前仍然需要有手動根管銼(hand file)當開路先鋒,取得「初步手工滑行路徑」(initial manual glide path),再以「鎳鈦旋轉路徑搜索銼」(rotary NiTi pathfinder)預備出「光滑平順的滑行路徑」(reproducible glide path),舖上足夠寬度的光滑滑行路徑才能讓鎳鈦旋轉根管銼順利地滑行到根尖孔端。手動和鎳鈦旋轉根管銼兩者之間是相輔相成,有互補的作用。手動和電動旋轉根管銼各有其優缺點的特性。以手動路徑搜索銼搜索管道需要有充裕的時間、耐心、經驗、顯微或放大鏡、光纖光源照明及對管道三度空間的

認知。手動路徑搜索銼的操作有如下的優點: (1) 讓操作者知道直線進入管道是否已經達 成。(2) 提供操作者對管道解剖形態的認知, 例如,管道的存在、彎曲度、彎曲走向和鈣 化程度等等。(3) 當管道搜尋的斥侯。(4) 給予 镍鈦旋轉根管锉初步的舖上滑行路徑,讓鎳 鈦旋轉根管銼的折斷率減至最低。(5) 提供工 作長度測量 (X-光或電子儀器測量均需要) 的媒介。(6) 不需要額外的手機(handpiece)。 Peters 以體外實驗得到結論:手動根管銼提供 旋轉根管銼被動地順利滑行到根尖孔,可以 增加安全性 16。Berutti 2004年以體外實驗, 結論出如果滑行路徑有良好的取得,在他的 實驗室裡,旋轉根管銼是沒有斷裂的17,更倡 議滑行路徑可以增加鎳鈦旋轉根管銼的使用壽 命, 甚至於有6倍之多17, 在他的2012年另 外一篇報導,有滑行路徑取得的管道,其後續 修形的管道彎曲度比較有受到尊重,而保留原

1. K 型手動根管銼(K-type file)

來的彎度。

找到根管入口後,以10號K型根管銼嘗試探索頸部和中段管道的暢通性,然後以開口擴大銼(orifice opener)或蓋氏鑽鑿(Gates Glidden drill)擴大管道口,避開內彎側口牙本質。如果牙髓還在,滴入EDTA溶劑;如果牙髓已經壞死,放入EDTA或NaOCl溶劑,再放入尖端微微彎曲的10號根管銼,如果有阻力,取出再做比較大的彎曲度,順著管道的彎曲走向順滑,不能施加壓力,如有阻力時,改以8號根管銼進入,不通行再改以6號根管銼嘗試。手的力道務必比高速手機磨牙的力道還小,否則,根管銼的尖端很容易自己找尋路徑而造成種種醫源性的失誤。West 提議以K型根管銼模仿手

錶上發條順逆時鐘方向轉動微微進入管道一直到達根尖孔端,再以上下垂直方向進出,一直到 10 號根管銼在管道裡進出 4~5 毫米非常的鬆弛而且暢通了(a "super loose" size 10 K-file),才算是已經取得了手動「初步的手工滑行路徑」⁶。

2. 加強型手動路徑搜索銼

(upgraded hand or manual pathfinders)

目前許多廠商都有生產比不銹鋼更堅韌的熱處理過強化型金屬根管路徑搜索銼,如表一作者所搜集。它們比 K 型不銹鋼根管銼有更堅韌的垂直抗彎曲鋼性變形 (buckling resistance) 能耐 (圖 2)。Allen MJ 等人 2007 年的文獻號稱是第一篇研究加強型手動路徑搜索銼的文章,在其 11 種類的研究對象中,以D finder 和 S finder 的效能最佳,Hi-5 和 C+最堅韌,Pathfinder CS 和 Pathfinder SS 最柔

軟¹⁹。這些根管銼有 不同的 ISO 尖端號 碼,設計成不同形 狀的橫切面,不同 的斜錐度,螺紋間 距 (pitch),凹槽 (flute)等設計。有 一些是 ISO 沒有的 中間號碼銼,例如, 7、12.5號(表一)。

Kwak 比較 15 號手動路徑搜索銼(C+和兩種 K型根管銼)和鎳鈦手動路徑搜索銼(NiTiFlex K-file)的金屬性質,提出兩者的特性是不相同的,使用的目的也不相同,另一方面的結論是 C+ 根管銼抵抗垂直或縱向的扭曲應力比較強,適用於搜索管道,而 NiTiFlex K-file 適合做根尖區「滑行路徑」的取得 20。以上所列 1 和 2 項路徑搜索銼的缺點有操作者身心和手的勞累;冗長的時間 21 及改變原來管道形態的疑慮 22:刮出的碎屑有被推出根尖孔外的疑慮 23。Lopes 等人 2012 年實驗結果顯示,C+file 比 C-Pilot file(VDW, Munch, Germany)的抗縱向扭曲應力強 24。

順逆重複運轉式手機接K型根管銼:Kinsey和 Mounce 2008年倡議以K型手動根管銼在抵達根尖孔的瞬間,改換成M4 reciprocatinghandpiece手機(SybronEndo, Orange, CA)接手,30度順時鐘30度逆時鐘在900 rpm/0.6-0.8 Ncm時速運轉下,直到15號或20號K型根管銼可以在管道裡自由進出5毫米間距為止²⁵。如此,可以減少手的勞累及節省時間,這等於是手動平衡力法(balanced forcemethod)的2.0版本,改以電動旋轉擴大。其他可以使用的類似手機有Endo-Expressreciprocatinghandpiece(Essential DEhtal System, NJ, USA); NSK Ti-Max X35L 10:1

reciprocating handpiece (NSK, Nakanishi, Japan),90度轉動。優缺點在 Cassium 文章 有提出:減少預備的時間;操作者及手較不會勞累;減少旋轉根管銼的折斷率。缺點是需要有特別的手機;如果在管道內的工作時間過長,可能會移除過多的牙本質;可能會有碎屑被推出根尖孔的疑慮;觸覺感減少3。

小偏方:順逆重複運轉根管銼或剪短的 K 型根管銼或其他。

作者大都使用 C-files 及 C+files 搜索管 道。偶爾,遇到嚴重鈣化變形 (calcific metamorphosis) 或相當不規則的管道,上述的方 法都無法讓根管銼進到根尖孔,甚至於6號 根管銼也進不去,而陷入僵局。不得其門而 入的情況下,作者會以 ScoutRaCe NiTi rotary pathfinder file (FKG, Switzerland) 10/.02 旋 轉路徑搜索銼在 900rpm/0.8-1.0 Ncm 時速下 轉動,如圖3,4。有時候不一定可行,可是一 但可以順利地進入根尖孔端,頓時之間會有 「山窮水盡疑無路,柳暗花明又一村」(宋代 陸游)豁然開朗的驚喜交加之感。Zuolo號 稱是第一篇文章以順逆重複運轉根管銼 R25 (VDW, Munch, Germany) 搜索探勘 338 顆 有 MB2 管道的上顎臼齒,其折斷率為 0.56%, 並且號稱比手動搜索銼提升了32%的成功










率 ²⁶。Yard 以病例報告介紹四顆牙齒以 Mtwo 10/04 及 R25 旋轉根管銼以順逆重複轉動直接取得滑行路徑,完成了治療 ²⁷。也有學者把 K型根管銼尖端減除一毫米成為 ISO 的中間號碼,例如,15 號成為了 17 號,抗縱向扭曲應力也加強了 ²⁸。

甚至有學者建議以喇叭形退展法(step-back pre-flaring)取得根尖管道的暢通,方法是如果 8 號根管銼下不去了,手動幾次取出;以 10 號管銼比 8 號稍微短些放入管道,手動幾下;繼續退展一直到 30 號,這時侯,8 號的根管銼就有可能可以進入到根尖孔端,如果還是進不去,可以再重複退展法一次直到根管銼進入為止 ²⁹。

作者建議有些鑲有牙套的牙齒,因為原來的牙冠縱軸已經被改變,根管入口有時候會一時不容意找到,可以徵求患者同意把牙套去除,會比較可以定位。

結論

管道探索的目的是要排除管道裡的解剖 學上的障礙物,而不是要製造出醫源性的障 礙物。否則,反過來會變成牙齒來控制您而 一發不可收拾。我們得尊重自然管道的三度 空間,把我們的心力連結到手動路徑搜索銼 的2豪米尖端,心手相應,運用之妙在於 一心。不要施加不當的壓力而造成管壁窗台 (ledge)。要心平氣和、在不慌不忙不亂的 心情下搜索管道,進不去並不表示管道已經 百分之百阻塞,早一點轉給專科醫師或想一 想其他可行的變通方法,往往會在下一次診 療時「心閒手敏」而很快就可以進入管道。 本文獻介紹以手動路徑搜索銼取得「初步手 工滑行路徑」。滑行路徑的取得在鎳鈦旋轉根 管銼使用於管道的清創及修形上扮演著至高 無上的角色;如果沒有初步手工滑行路徑的 取得在先,旋轉根管銼等於是英雄無用武之 地。滑行路徑的取得要分成兩個階段:(1)動 用許多隻新的手動K型根管銼搜索探勘在先 (不是製造出)來取得「初步的手工滑行路 徑」後,(2) 再以鎳鈦旋轉路徑搜索銼完成「光 滑平順的精緻再造滑行路徑」(reproducible glide path)來讓後續的鎳鈦旋轉根管銼能順 滑(slip and slide)至根尖孔端,完成充填前 理想的管道清創擴大與修形。

Abstract

Identifying and negotiating calcified canals and negotiating canals which have become blocked short of working length are tedious and time consuming clinical problems. This review article discusses the kinds of hand pathfinder instruments available for negotiating such canals.

Croatia & Slovenia Trip



For my wife and I, our trip to Croatia and Slovenia started when we stopped in Frankfurt for a layover. This was our first trip to Europe, so almost everything we experienced was exciting. Our flight to Dubrovnik wasn't for another few hours, so that gave us plenty of time to explore the confusing and expansive airport of Frankfort. Though it may be silly, even seeing their frankfurter food stand warranted a stop and picture. The way they dispense condiments is 'udderly' fantastic.

When we finally got to Dubrovnik, our wonderful tour guide Vicky guided us to old-town Dubrovnik where we were surrounded by people, fantastic architecture, and Game of Thrones paraphernalia. We dined at the Klarisa Restaurant; a beautiful restaurant that used to be a monastery built in the 13th century, right next to the Pile Gate, where our group was able to enjoy our first Croatian meal, wine, and music. Only a few hours in and we were already enveloped in the beauty of old town Dubrovnik. After dinner, we all separated to explore the city. With the sounds of swallows flying above, and the slippery limestone paved roads below, it felt as if we were in a different world. As we made our way past locals readying for the summer festival and the endless narrow alleyways, we decided to head back to our hotel to rest up for the next day.





Woke up at 3am. Whether it was excitement or jetlag, I didn't waste time lying around so I did a solo exploration of post-midnight Dubrovnik before waking my wife up for the gym. After a hearty breakfast, which included delicious freshly squeezed orange juice and many labeled cheeses, we started our official tour of the old town.

As we walked through old-town Dubrovnik, our tour guides bombarded us with information both real and fantastical. At times, it was hard to distinguish what was real history and what was fiction as the local tour guide switched between facts about St. Blaise, Yugoslavia, King's Landing, and dragons within a blink of an eye. But as we made our way deeper into the city, real history was being presented to us in everything we saw.

The city of Dubrovnik was first established around the 7th century, and to this day, is predominately Roman Catholic. Though very beautiful, we learned that Dubrovnik was a very different city before the big earthquake in 1667 that destroyed the whole town. Before the quake, many of the buildings had elaborate balconies that people used to measure their wealth; the wealthier the family, the more extravagant the balcony. Today, only a few structures remain untouched such as Sponza Palace, where locals use its surviving balcony for theater performances.

We passed many historical monuments and buildings. Some of the more intriguing ones include Orlando's Column, where people actually used the statue knight's right arm as a measurement of length, called an "elbow". Another amazing structure was the Lazzarettos of Dubrovnik; a building used in the past to quarantine those who were sick during times of plague epidemics. We also passed by the many merchants, though most plentiful were stores that advertised "Official Game of Thrones Merchandise".

Croatian history was not only experienced with our eyes and ears, but through taste as well. As we walked past the local farmer markets, Vicky treated us to sugared almonds and sugared orange peels. These delicious delights are still made using the same age-old recipes. One of the most memorable treats not only in Dubrovnik but also for the whole trip was the lemon sorbet from Peppino's, which is still made using the traditional thousand-year-old recipe. Gelato was one of the bribing tools used by Dr. Jeng and Dr. Lee to coerce cooperation of the younger two in our group, Christian and Lauren.

Our tour of Dubrovnik ended with a cable car's journey to a point overlooking the old town. After a group picture near the giant cross, given to Dubrovnik by Napoleon, our group split up. Some went to catch up on sleep, some to shop. But for my wife and I, more exploration that included great local food, a ferry to Lokrum Island, pictures with peacocks and giant rabbits, sitting on the actual Iron Throne, and more Peppino's. We met up with the group again to eat at the elegant Nautika

restaurant, sitting on the balcony, overlooking the Adriatic Sea as the sun set.















hills of olive and fig trees and witnessed the oyster farms in the estuaries. Very soon, we made our way to Bosnia territory.

Only a 20km stretch of coastline, our bus driver and tour guide expressed the frustration and political issues between locals in the area. We were educated on the history of Yugoslavia and the eventual Yugoslav wars, which lead to the seven independent states we have today. We even learned of plans of erecting a bridge to bypass border checkpoints. But despite all the tensions, many Croatian locals do cross the border to enjoy lower pricing on goods, especially cigarettes. After a quick bathroom stop by the town of Neum, it only took us roughly 10 minutes to get back to Croatian territory. Our bus driver was able to use his charm to smoothen our border crossing.

It took another hour's drive to get to the ferry to Hvar. A few cups of coffee and a few dozen rock skips later, we boarded the ferry and made our way to the island of Hvar. There, we met with our tour guide Yelena; a local born and raised on the island. Sometimes called the 'sunniest island', Hvar is also known as 'lavender island', where local people carry on the tradition of cultivating their lavender fields to produce oils, soaps, and even honey where they sell right in front of their homes. We learned that roughly 4,000 people live on the island but never full time due to the sometimes-harsh weather conditions. Fortunately, we had the privilege of dining at the Pinjata Winery, a hidden gem in Vbroska that dates back to the 16th century. We had a home cooked meal and had a generous amount of different red and white wines. At the end of the meal, the host had us each sample their famous red Grappa and white dessert wine. With warm faces and full bellies, we said our goodbyes and headed to our next destination.

After finally passing car with flat tire, our bus driver gracefully maneuvered the extremely narrow road to the Beach Resort Amfora, where the people in our group each got upgraded sea view rooms. A picturesque view of the Pakleni Islands greeted us as we watched the sun set. After dinner, we had to chance to shop at the many local lavender vendors before navigating back to the hotel.

After having a large breakfast with the biggest milk selection I've ever seen, we made our way to the town of Trogir; a UNESCO world heritage site known for its iconic Venetian architecture. There was so much history packed on such a small island. Over the past two thousand years, various empires ruled the town and surrounding areas. Much of this can be witnessed by viewing the Cathedral of Trogir, where each floor was built in a different style corresponding to the century.

It was near the cathedral where our tour guide explained to us the history of the winged lion of St. Mark; a familiar sculpture we've seen throughout our journey at different locations. She further explained the local legend that if the book the lion holds is open, it symbolizes that period was a time of peace and learning. However, if the book is closed, it meant it was a time of war. We only spotted one lion with a closed book so far, on the island of Hyar.

As we walked closer to the entrance, we witnessed the traditional a cappella group called 'klapa'. The beautiful harmonization had many people stop and pull out their cellphones. Soon after, we were able to enter the cathedral. A solid 10 minutes was spent admiring the door to the cathedral; the most famous part of the building. The intricate carvings by the ancient sculpture Radovan was a marvel to behold. Once inside, we witnessed the main area for prayer. The entire floor consisted of the graves of nobility- paid to be closer to God. As we navigated our way through the many rooms, we ended the tour with a very narrow and steep 47-meter climb to the top of the bell tour overlooking the entire city.

At exactly 12pm, we heard the cathedral bells we saw earlier resonate throughout the town. Lunch was at the famous Konoba Trs restaurant, known for their cauliflower soup and cherry brandy coffee, which Dr. Liu had an extra shot of. After another serving of gelato, we headed out for our final destination: Zadar. The hour and a half bus ride felt like minutes as everyone in the group napped to klapa music playing in the background.

There were many things to see in Zadar. It happened to be the night of the full moon and summer festival, so many locals and tourists alike were about celebrating. Our first stop was at the coast, where we witnessed and listened to the famous works by Croatian architect Nikola Bašić. There is nothing quite like the sounds produced by both sea and wind from the Sea Organ. As we've seen in other cities, many of the preserved architecture date from different periods in time. Though WWII damaged much of the city, we were still able

to see Italian influenced churches, sacrificial alters from Roman times, and the iconic pillar of shame. Streets handmade by Romans were still intact, including 30km of an old aqueduct that still functions today. Other notable sites include the oldest pharmacy in town that dates back to the 16th century, and stores that sell locally cultivated Marasca cherry products, such as the famous Maraschino liqueur.

Our day concluded with dinner at one of the top 10 restaurants in Croatia, JRE-Foša, and a walk back to the Sea Organ to witness the Zagreb sunset English filmmaker Alfred Hitchcock deemed 'the most beautiful sunset in the world'. Once the sun set, we were all able to see the second creation from Nikola Bašić, Greeting to the Sun.







It was nice and sunny when we started our hike to view the lower 4 lakes. It was a nicer day and an easier hike with breath-taking views. Along the path, we saw piles of limestone ready to transport to other locations as building materials. We took the famous s-curved wooden path to view the Veliki Slap, which translates to Large Waterfall. After a multitude of pictures, we headed toward the best restaurant in the area, Restoran "Rastoke" Mirjana and Rastoke, for lunch. We were served a large palate of cheese and cured meats, a main dish of their famous roasted lamb, and of course, ended the meal with a cup of coffee. From there, we journeyed on out of Croatia to Slovenia.

Without much prior knowledge of the country, we were soon surrounded by green when entering the border to Slovenia. With over half of the country covered in forests, Slovenia is the third most forested country in Europe.

Though the country isn't very large, it was beautiful driving through the mountainous areas to our destination of Lake Bled.

We received lake-view rooms at the Hotel Toplice, Slovenia's first 5-star hotel visited by celebrities and political dignitaries from all over the world. The view was surreal; trees all around, a castle on the

cliff over a lake. It was like something taken out of a fairytale. This was one of, if not, the most beautiful place I've ever been to. After dinner, we explored the small town while listening to the church bells ring in the distance.









Most in our group enjoyed a scenic bike ride around the lake before breakfast. It was definitely a change of pace from the earlier parts of our trip. Trees and nature instead of crowds and buildings surrounded us. After breakfast, we met with our local guide Natasha for a tour of the town.

Our first destination was Bled Castle, the oldest castle in Slovenia. Built in the 11th century by German King Henry II, the castle was later donated to bishops along with the land and local farms. As we explored the castle, Natasha pointed out a room containing a printing press. Surprisingly, the 1st book

printed was not the bible like the rest of Europe. Instead,

the first book the bishops printed was a grammar book.

Most of the castle is now fashioned into a museum containing various objects and artifacts throughout Slovenia's history. One unique item was a bathtub made of zinc used by natural healer Arnold Rikli. His therapies with the basis that sunshine, air, and water equate to health became very popular in 1855 and brought tourism to Slovenia.

Our next destination was Bled Island. Motorized boats are not allowed in the lake, so we took the traditional route by pletna. Pletna boats date back to the 1590s and the boats and oarsmen all belong to the same individual families given the right centuries ago. While on the boat, the Natasha explained that the church on the island is a very popular venue for weddings. It was tradition for the groom to carry the bride up the 99 stairs that lead to the church to ensure a happy marriage. After landing and some light goading, Wilson, Sam, and I took the challenge. Cheers from the local people enjoying their coffees at the top of the stairs greeted us after we conquered the climb. Happiness or not, I did not want to go up any more stairs for the rest of the day. We entered the church and each couple made wishes while ringing the church bells. After a final pletna ride off the island, we had lunch at Vila Bled. Not only did we get to try the famous Bled cake, but we were able to see the famous mural in President Tito's cinema room.

From here, Sam and Hannah went kayaking while the rest of the group travelled to Vintgar Gorge. The rest of the day included much of the same; more food and relaxation all while basking in the picturesque view of Lake Bled.



Though reluctant to leave, we travelled from Lake Bled to the capital of Slovenia, Ljubljana. Also called the 'green capital', Ljubljana is Slovenia's largest city situated only an hour drive away from Croatia, Italy, Austria, or Hungary. We walked on several bridges built to deal with the traffic. As we've seen with other cities, many Roman structures still remain intact. Our local guide Peter pointed out several things as we traveled deeper. The trash system is underground to maintain cleanliness and beauty. Just like other major cities, Ljubljana has a citywide bike rental system. But unlike other cities, the rentals are free for residents. Education is also completely free of charge, even to the highest level.

Besides educating our group about different sculptures or monuments, Peter described the life of a local. He described the city as extremely safe; he lost his own house keys years ago and doesn't worry about it. Triglav, the highest mountain in Slovenia depicted on the country's coat of arms, is the national symbol. He mentioned that a person is not a true Slovenian if he or she does not climb to the top at least once in his or her lifetime. After the tour, we were given time to explore and shop. We enjoyed much in the 'Dragon city', from exotic cured meats and honey brandy, to Adriatic sea salt chocolate and fresh milk only dispensed in vending machines. But soon, it was time to move on to the next location.

Our last stop in Slovenia was the Postojna Cave. Formed over 2 million years ago by the Pivka River, the cave stays a constant 10°C. This was probably the only time we put on jackets during the entire trip. We took a cute, yet


well built train deeper into the cave system passing many different stalactite/stalagmite structures and fancy chandeliers. Soon, we were surrounded by the dripstone formations. We learned that they're all formed from rainwater. It takes roughly 100 years for 1cm of growth.

The cave was first discovered in 1818 and the first tourists came the year after. Every year since then, people explore further and further. Now, they are up to 25km. It was beautiful to see not just the individual stalactite and stalagmite formations, but the combination of structures that formed pillars and curtains.

Lauren especially liked the parts of the cave with "spaghetti ceilings". At first, people thought that nothing was able to live in such a dark and isolated environment. But to their surprise, they discovered all sorts of creatures such as spiders, beetles, and different bacteria. The largest of all creatures discovered in the cave habitat was the baby dragon: the salamander. The olm salamander can live up to 100 years and has adapted to survive without food for up to 7 years. Though hard to spot, we were able to see some of the baby dragons at the end of the tour.











After a good nights rest at the Hotel Esplanade, the most luxurious hotel in the city, we started the last tour of our trip. It was only fitting that our last day was spent at Croatia's capital and largest city, Zagreb. With a rich history dating back to Roman times, Zagreb is a very important hub for transport connecting Central Europe, the Mediterranean, and Southeast Europe. Our tour guide Martina explained that due to geography, there is a big diversity between north and south. Not only is architecture different, but even attitude and language. The north is more influenced by Austrians and Hungarians, while Italians influence the south more.

Martina described many changes that happened to the city and country after events such as the 1880 earthquake and both world wars. There is so much history, but she reminded us that Croatia itself is actually only 28 years old since its independence in 1991 from Yugoslavia. We learned much of the country's turbulent history that led it to be what it is today.

Soon we reached Ban Jelačić Square, where Martina showed us pictures of the ½ million people gathered last

year in 2018 to celebrate the Croatian Soccer team's 2nd place title for the world cup. Although they didn't win the world cup, they

celebrated as if they did.
She mentioned people waited over 9 hours

just to congratulate and shake the team's hands'. After a few pictures of the area, we made our way out of the square to ride the shortest funicular in the world to the upper part of the city, Gradec.

We walked passed

Lotrščak Tower, one of the last standing buildings since the earthquake. Martina pointed out a canon at the top of the tower which fires everyday at 12pm and has done so for the past 100+ years. As we walked further into the upper city, we passed the Museum of Broken Relationships, and the Nikola Tesla Museum; a place honoring the Croatian inventor. We saw several mom and pop shops, many selling the original Kravata necktie. Legend has it that only women knew how to tie the knot and if a man came back with a different knot, she knew he was cheating.

Martina walked us further through the old town pointing out different buildings and explaining the history, including the tallest building in all of Croatia, the Cathedral of Zagreb. There was a regulation the prevented any other building from being taller than the cathedral, hence no skyscrapers in Croatia. She explained that the cathedral was once baroque style, but after the earthquake, the renovations took on a gothic style. Although renovations are still ongoing, the structure was no doubt a wonder. As we explored the interior, we noticed beautiful stained glass from Italy and 3 unique golden chandeliers. Apparently, the chandeliers were donated from a casino in the United States. Although many locals are not happy with the incorporation of the sinful objects, the bishop gave the green light and people pray everyday to wash away the sins.

During lunch, Martina explained that the quality of coffee is quite nice in Croatia. Starbucks has not made its way into the country because the coffee drinking culture doesn't match. While usually people grab Starbucks on the go or to drink while working, locals use coffee to slow down and relax. A lunch break in Croatia can stretch for 1-3 hours with a cup of coffee. After finishing our lunch, we each got to relax with our own cup of coffee before splitting up to explore the city.

The city of Zagreb was very exciting to see. Although we couldn't explore everything in a single day, we shared experiences and pictures after meeting up for dinner at the famous Zinfandel's restaurant. Our final dinner in Croatia included many toasts, remembrances, and at the end, a celebration of Sam's birthday.

Signet Tours and Best Choice Travels did a wonderful job putting together an itinerary making our trip amazingly memorable. Though our group was small, I couldn't ask for better travel companions. I am glad that my first trip to Europe was to these two beautiful countries and I hope I will be able to go again in the future.




